Steeple Cove Nursery

This week Steeple Cove have been learning about textures. The children have explored textures through making a collage based on the '*That's not my*' books, exploring how each material they used felt. We enjoyed a wonderful music session with Mrs Bickle on Tuesday, exploring the different instruments with Yarmer class.



Yarmer (Reception/Year 1)

This week in Maths, Year 1 have started their addition and subtraction unit, exploring part-whole models, while Reception have been learning all about the number 3. Reception have also begun their *Word Time* sessions in Read Write Inc working towards blending sounds to read words. In Geography, we've thoroughly enjoyed drawing our own maps of Thurlestone and exploring the shapes of familiar places from an aerial view!

Leas Foot (Year 1 and 2)

Leas Foot had a fun start to the week, proudly sharing their fabulous Harvest paintings! We then became artists for the afternoon, out in the sunshine. All enjoyed another great Forest School Session, showing excellent teamwork. In maths we have been focussing on number bonds to 10 and word problems based around these. Children have shown great perseverance with computing skills too this week and have enjoyed exploring how to paint using computers!

Sedgewell Cove (Year 3 and 4)

Sedgewell have been busy planning their own Traditional Tales this week and have been thinking of how they can include all the features they have been learning in their stories. In Maths we have been learning to round to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000 as we draw our learning about Place Value to a close. We have also thoroughly enjoyed welcoming Miss Palmer to our class who will be training with us for a few months.

Butter Cove (Year 4 and 5)

The children have been working hard and drafting their creative writing and have used many writing techniques to create some great narrative stories. Understanding the importance of estimating and using the inverse calculations has been the theme this week in maths, making sure they check their column addition and subtraction for accuracy. The children really enjoyed thinking about themselves and the world around them (The in, the out and the up) and interpreting this in drawings.



Bantham (Year 6)

This week I have been blown away with the incredible attitude and politeness everyone has shown to the supply teachers covering me on Tuesday and Wednesday! The feedback I have had is incredible! Well done Bantham. In maths this week, we have explored division and as writers we have spent a long time drafting and editing our big writes!
