Yarmer (Reception/Year 1)

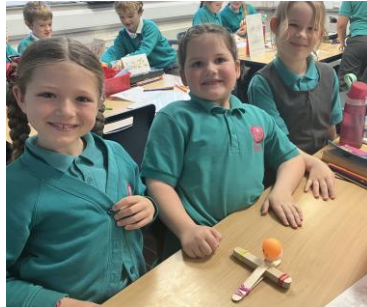
